
My biggest complaint about the car is I don't drive it enough. My biggest like, it's pretty quick :).

# International Mustang Meet 2017 Helena MT.

A group of Mustangs met at the Post Falls rest stops Thursday morning August 31st to convoy to Helena MT. for the big Mustang show. The weather was hot but the Mustangs had for the most part an enjoyable 350 mile journey. There were 2 Classics that started to have fuel system issues climbing the big hill just outside Helena. One Mustang driven by Lyle and Sue Manley sputtered to a stop almost reaching the summit. Since this an International Mustang Meet (IMM) the Vancouver BC. Mustang club drove up shortly after with a large supply of tools and spare parts. The car fortunately just needed to cool off and was on its merry way to Helena. Kelly also was having some sputtering issues however did get to the top of the hill and it was smooth sailing to Helena from there.

Our Club had about 15 cars make it to the IMM, some winning prizes, including Jana and Mel Craven, Kelly and a few others. There were 350 Mustangs and Ford powered cars at the show. There were vendors, lots of food available and the local club was giving out free bottled water. The Host Hotel was very nice the parking arrangements also were outstanding. On Friday night there was the traditional Beer Keg party. It was held in a parking lot across the street from the host hotel. Free finger foods were available as well.

On Saturday, after the show was the picnic / barbeque which was held off-site at the County Fair Grounds. Beef brisket was served. On Sunday there were many activities. One Mustang club member has a private collection of about 50 cars. There was a boat cruise on the Missouri river. My wife and I, along with about 10 other IEMC club members, went on the cruise and it was absolutely wonderful and well narrated by the boat's captain.

I attended the IMM meeting where it was confirmed that next year's show will be just south of Edmonton Alberta. I would recommend going as there are lots of sights to see on the way, including the Drumheller Alberta Dinosaur Museum. The 2019 Show will be in Great Falls MT. The Spokane show will be in 2021. The committee voted to have an IMM website with pictures of past shows. Tutorials of how to put on a successful IMM, forms and other information will be available for clubs to share. There are 12 clubs involved in the IMM, some are large and some are a bit small. It was stressed that if possible some of the members from bigger clubs can help the smaller ones at the show with things like parking. There will be a spring IMM meeting in April in Calgary Alberta.

The Banquet Sunday evening handed out trophies and flashed pictures on the big screen of the various class winners. The Edmonton Club had a presentation of the hotel, activities and even had a hotel representative there to answer questions and take reservations. The hotel was over 80% booked by the end of the night. I will have more information after the spring meeting and the big show gets closer.

Monday morning the host hotel put on a buffet breakfast and all the Mustangs departed to their respective homes. The International is about the cars, of course, however, making new friends with similar interests is just as big a part of the IMM as are the Mustangs.

Summary report from the Helena group, 345 cars registered, everything went very well this weekend, and they are ready for the awards banquet. Nathan organized the Friday night social and BBQ, he did a great job! They noticed that some of the classes were very heavy, especially in the newer year Mustangs. Another reason why pre-registration is sooo important. The hotel parking lot was compact and very good for the show. The Club had 260 pre-registrations, mostly the older models though. Something on note for Boise, 12 members of the Helena Club did the majority of organizing for this event. And the host club really appreciates all the assistance from members of other clubs that helped out! Carl wanted to make sure everyone, including the Boise members present, know that we are all there to help...once you are in the IMM, you are part of the herd!! J

Johnny asked if there were any questions from those in attendance:

Hotels are accepting registrations now, a rep from the host hotel will be at the banquet to accept registrations in person and we will have 2 rooms to give away as early registration draws. AMOA website had a registration form posted and shows the hotel info. Facebook Page (IMM39) is also active. Castrol Raceway will cost \$40, onsite at the track.

### **New Business:**

Carl indicated that Great Falls would be next in line for an IMM and asked if they are ready to accept...reps indicated the Club is already working on plans for the event, Heritage Inn Hotel has been secured, they will provide more information at the Spring Meeting. General discussion about classes and trophies – at the end of the day more sponsorship likely means more trophies/classes.
